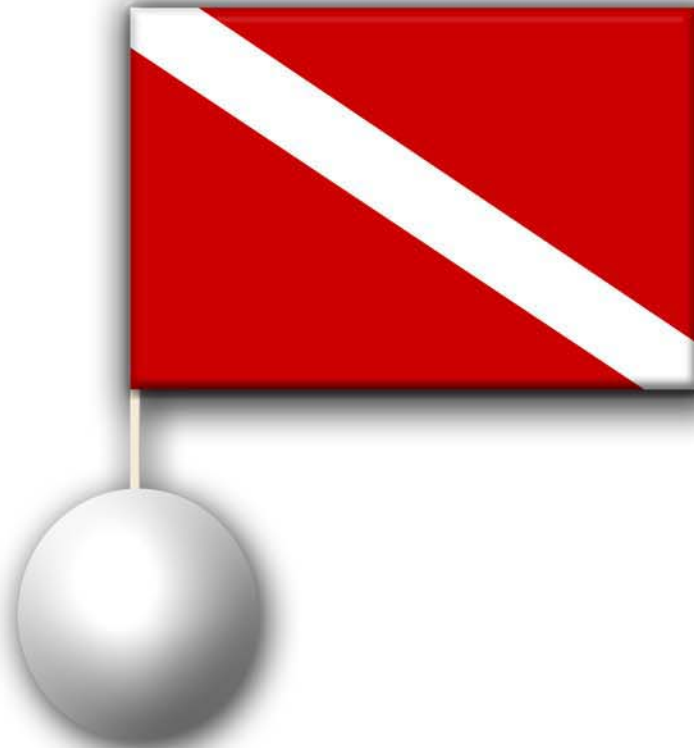


# Attention Divers and Boaters

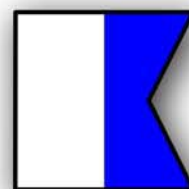
## Under Hawaii Administrative Rule §13-245-9



~A diver's flag is a red flag no less than 12" x 12" in size with a white diagonal line running from the upper left corner to the lower right corner.

~Divers are required by law to use a flag when diving or swimming underwater in navigable waters and may surface no more than 100' from their dive flag (50' in a navigable stream).

~The flag may be attached to a float or mounted on the highest point of a vessel up to 16' in length and visible from all directions. Vessels over 16' must display a 20"x24" flag along with a blue alpha flag mounted at the highest point of the vessel and visible from all directions.



~Vessels are prohibited from approaching within 100' of a displayed diver's flag (50' in a navigable stream) unless conducting SCUBA, snorkeling, or free diving activities. These vessels may approach within the restricted area at a speed of slow-no-wake.

~Violators of HAR §13-245-9 are subject to imprisonment and/or a fine of up to \$1,000.
